
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

ASVAB TESTING FOR MILITARY BOUND STUDENTS- OCTOBER 13TH 9:00 AM AT GJHS IN THE CAFETERIA

This is a multiple-aptitude battery test that measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success in the military. This test will be administered at Grand Junction High School, students do not need to sign up. Just show up at 9:00 am! This a "blind" test meaning that students will get their scores and it will not be sent directly to recruiters.

CONSTRUCTION TRADES CAREER TRIP-TUESDAY, OCTOBER 10TH 10:00-2:00

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COLORADO FREE APPLICATION DAYS-October 17-19

All Colorado colleges will waive application fees during this window. This can save students and families hundreds of dollars! All the details and application codes can be found here. Students are encouraged to start their applications through the colleges' websites or the Common Application early, and then submit with the appropriate codes during the free application window. Counselors will be helping with this process during this time period and during our Senior Workday on October 18th.

COLLEGE & MONEY NIGHT AT COLORADO MESA UNIVERSITY (MEYERS BALLROOM)- OCTOBER 23rd 6:00-8:00

College and Money night is hosted by CMU, but students do NOT need to be attending CMU in order to go to this event. Financial aid reps will talk about getting ready for FAFSA (it will open in December instead of the typical date of October 1st). Families will also learn about ASCENT, scholarships, and how to complete the first step of the FAFSA- your FSA ID. Students are encouraged to bring their families to this event!

CONCURRENT INTEREST MEETING IN THE PHS LIBRARY- OCTOBER 25TH 11:00 AM

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What is an IB Education?



The IB Middle Years Program (MYP) has a visual model of the teaching framework and is an excellent overview of an IB education. At the core of all IB programs is the learner profile. These traits include:

Knowledgeable, Risk-Taker, Reflective, Communicator, Balanced, Thinker, Inquirer, Open-Minded, Principled, and Caring. Developing these traits in our students is the focus of the MYP at PHS. Surrounding the Learner Profile core are the Approaches to Learning and the Approaches to Teaching. The Approaches to Learning skills are those which are necessary to be a strong learner both inside and outside of the classroom. These are the skills employers look for when hiring, as well as the skills necessary to be a contributing member of local and global communities: Thinking, Communication, Social, Self-Management, and Research. Instruction in IB is focused on the intentional development of these skills.

The Approaches to Teaching skills are the strategies PHS teachers utilize to provide engaging, relevant, and rigorous learning in their classrooms. As MYP teachers we collaborate and plan our instruction. We are mindful of best practices in assessment, differentiation, student collaboration, and inquiry.

The next layer of the model shows equal distribution of each subject area. MYP at PHS is committed to providing broad, balanced, and connected courses. Students in MYP take each subject group concurrently to provide multiple opportunities to connect learning between the disciplines and receive a well-rounded education. Notice that an IB education is focused on the learner at the core. There is a commitment to prepare students to contribute to an ever-increasing global society and take action in their local community to "Think Globally, Act Locally."

Photos must be uploaded as a JPG file. The photo should reach a minimum standard of 3.0 megapixel resolution (300 dpi). Any lower resolution will be rejected. Photos with low resolution will appear pixelated in comparison to other photos.

Photos submitted must be vertical, due to the fact that no horizontal photos can be placed without major cropping.

Photos cannot contain any of the following: photographer watermark, double images, busy backgrounds and/or excessive shadows or anything obscuring the face.

Please respect the following dress/photo expectations for the photo & quote that you choose to submit:

- No photos/quotes can be submitted with any reference to guns/weapons, drugs, gangs, or sex will be rejected

Here are some details to keep in mind when making your purchase:

- Students are required to pay a \$5 Club Fee to Palisade High School in order to participate in the following discounts.
- All Checks should be made out to: Palisade High School Memo: Ski Club
- Early bird pricing for HS Passes is \$209.00, available until October 30th
- The regular price HS Pass is \$249.00, available from October 31st to December 15th
- No HS Passes will be available beyond the December 15th deadline
- Please submit the completed order form with payment by the deadline date directly to the accounting window at Palisade HIgh School.
- Parents must fill out the season pass waiver using the attached printable form or online link here: SEASON PASS WAIVER LINK
- No HS Passes will be available and there will be no additions or changes to rosters or invoices beyond the December 15th deadline
- If students had a pass last year, Powderhorn can reload their pass this year and they do not need to come to the ticket office WTP number (located on the bottom of pass) must be included on the order form
- For any students purchasing a pass this year who did not have a pass last year, we need to take a photo of them for submission to Powderhorn.
- Please note there are no Buddy Passes or Partner Mountain Access included on HS passes
- This program is for HS Ski & Board Club, or Outdoor Club, students and coaches only. Family members are not eligible.
- Students who have already purchased a 23-24 season pass will be credited the difference in pass price. Credit may be used any used at all Powderhorn locations/departments excluding lodging. No refunds will be made.
