Senior Photo Requirements

- Digital copy only
- Senior's name is printed and spelled correctly on CD or Flash Drive
- ****NEW**** school appropriate senior quote with author's name is attached in a word document on CD/USB
- Photo is saved as a .jpg file
- Photo is a minimum standard of 3.0 mega-pixel resolution (300 dpi).
- Photo is vertical
- Only one person is featured in the photo
- Photo does not have any of the following: soft focus, black and white, double images, or clothing inappropriate for school.
- Photo does not include: hands on the face, busy backgrounds and excessive shadows that obscure identification
